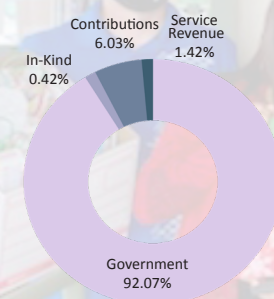

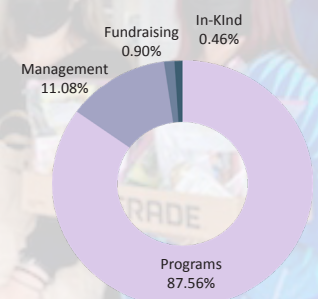

# 10 YEARS OF HOPE IN ACTION

In 2010 The Roman Catholic Church in the State of Hawaii established Hope Services Hawaii, Inc. as an affiliate non-profit organization.

2011

ULUWINI

Partnered with the County of Hawaii to open Na Kahua Hale O Ulu Wini, a community of 96 two-bedroom apartments, for houseless and low-income families in Kona

2013

OHEA HOUSE

In 2013, Hope launched Ohea House, a 5-bed clean and sober home for men. In 2015, Hope partnered with U.S Vets to convert Ohea House into Hilo’s first veteran-dedicated shelter. In 2019, Hope expanded its veteran services by adding an additional 5 beds in Kailua-Kona.

2015

COMMUNITY

Invested and established the Volunteer & Community Partnerships Program, allowing our community to share their gifts of time and talent in service of our houseless neighbors.

2017

HOUSING FIRST

Implemented the Housing First approach, which removes ineffective restrictions to help more people successfully overcome homelessness. Hope also implemented the State Rapid Rehousing program.

2019

STREET MEDICINE

In 2019, Hope partnered with Hui Mālama Ola Nā ‘Ōiwi to launch a Street Medicine program to bring medical care to the streets for those experiencing homelessness. The program pairs homeless outreach workers with clinicians and medical personnel to conduct weekly medical outreach missions for those living in homeless encampments.

Hope also opened Hawai’i Island’s first ‘Ohana Zone, Keolahou Emergency Shelter for men, in 2019.

2012

WOMEN SUPPORTING WOMEN

Co-founded Women Supporting Women, a supportive network of previously incarcerated women mentoring newly released women returning home from Women’s Community Correctional Center

2014

TROPICAL STORM ISELLE

Hope assisted in a multi-agency effort to provide emergency relief and supplies, and partnered with Hawai’i Island United Way to assist households in repairing their homes and restoring utilities, such as water catchment systems, rain gutters, and more.

2016

HALE KIKAHA

Began management of Hale Kikaha, a county owned facility in Kailua-Kona providing housing and services on site

2018

KILAUEA ERUPTION

Responded to the social services needs in our community due to the destruction of the lava eruption in lower Puna by partnering with 50+ businesses, community and philanthropic partners to lead the development of Sacred Heart Shelter, a village of twenty (20) micro-units in Pahoa that is providing shelter to older adults.

2020

COVID RESPONSE

COVID Response including Street Medicine outreach and testing, partnership with Holiday Inn Express and Kamuela Inn, and micro-shelters Hale Hanakahi in Hilo and Hale Kulike in Kona. Keolahou served as distribution center for USDA food drops
